Antibiotic A leading cause of hospital readmissions is Sepsis.

Sepsis is one of the most under recognized and misunderstood conditions by healthcare providers

It is the body's extreme and life-threatening response to infection. The body normally releases chemicals into the bloodstream to fight an infection. Sepsis occurs when the body's response to these chemicals is out of balance, triggering changes that can damage multiple organ systems, tissue damage and death.

It happens quickly and is a medical emergency. Time matters

Screen for sepsis and notify the physician **immediately**

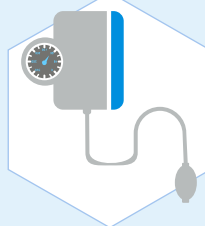

Suggest vital signs q shift as a nursing assessment when resident has suspected or confirmed infection and/or is on an antibiotic
