Heat Intolerance is an atypical sensitivity to heat. Affected individuals often have a dysfunctional autonomic nervous system, which regulates automatic body functions such as our cooling response to hot temperatures.

They may feel uncomfortably hot before others and may get overheated as temperatures rise.

This may result in other medical issues such as anxiety, intense sweating, dehydration, and even heat stroke.
